Senior Chore Program



*Helping seniors and adults with disabilities
live their lives independently.*





The Senior Chore Program...

...is designed to help seniors and adults with disabilities with their household tasks.

The program developed from a series of different neighborhood organizations responding to seniors in need, and has been in operation for over 20 years! It is funded in part by CEAP, the Older Americans Act, the Metropolitan Area Agency on Aging, the Minnesota Board on Aging, grants, and CDGB.

Through the program, clients living in Brooklyn Park, Brooklyn Center, Champlin, Osseo, & the Camden area of Minneapolis can get assistance in several areas (see next panel).

“They helped around the yard, blew the leaves from the bushes and took care of the flower bed. I had a hip replacement. I don’t know what I would have done without them. They were just wonderful!”

Our Services:

- **Seasonal Outdoor Work:** Workers and volunteers clean and change storm windows, rake yards, clean gutters, and trim shrubs.
- **Minor Home Maintenance:** Workers repair broken windows, leaky faucets and unsafe porch steps, perform minor electrical, carpentry and plumbing jobs, install locks, do minor weatherization and interior paint jobs, among other things. (No roof repairs)
- **Yard Work & Snow Removal:** Lawn and drive way maintenance such as mowing, trimming, weeding, and snow removal are provided.
- **Indoor Housekeeping:** Workers vacuum, clean floors, kitchens, and bathrooms, and do laundry. No food preparation, personal care, or mobility assistance is provided.



Eligibility & Payment:

In order to be eligible for CEAP’s Senior Chore Services you must:

- **Live in CEAP’s service area.**
(see far left panel)
- **Be 60 years of age or older, or be an adult with disabilities.**

Our fall raking and spring clean-up services are complimentary and volunteer based. However, our other services including lawn mowing, snow removal, and home maintenance are paid services. Workers from the community are hired as independent contractors. Background checks and interviews are conducted, and workers are paid an hourly rate by our clients immediately after the assigned work is completed.
